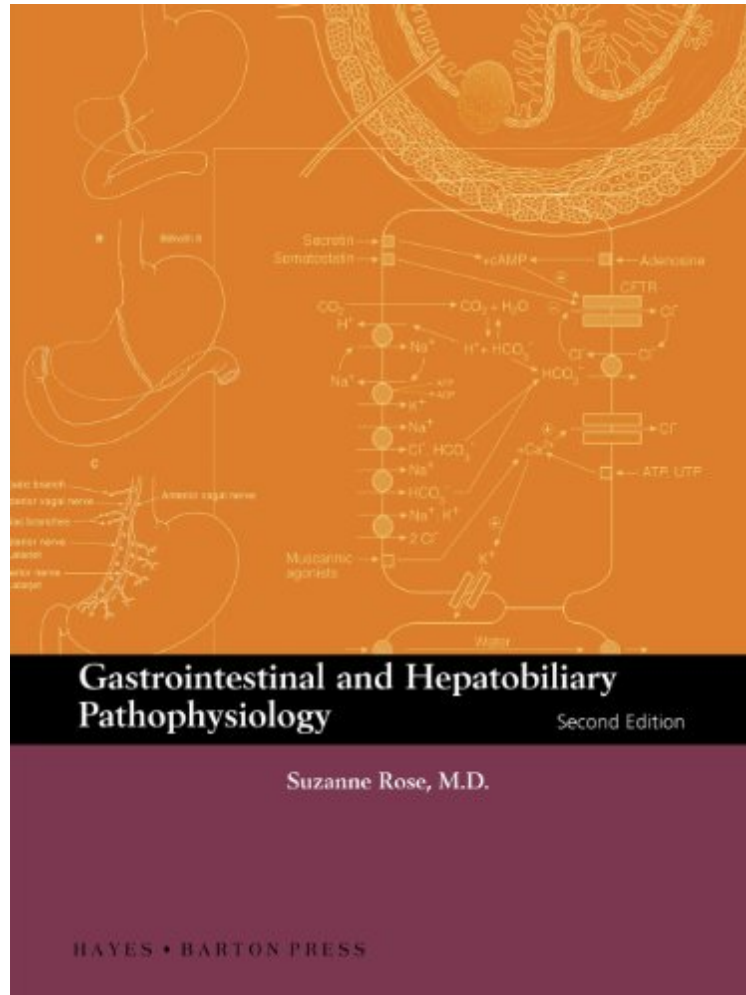

I like my course books to give in depth physiology and pathology sections that are easier and quicker to read than Robbins. This book did neither. All black and white, very difficult to read and does not keep interest up (not that any GI book can, but this one was especially dull). Physiology chapters went into great detail in basic subjects such as enteric nerve function and intracellular signaling pathways, but was severely lacking in the more broad and important GI physiology concepts. As far as the pathology sections, I actually prefer reading Robbins which says a lot as to how dull this book is. I suggest Lange GI

Physiology for the physiology and just using robbins for the pathology. Do not purchase this book for the purpose of first or second year medical study.
