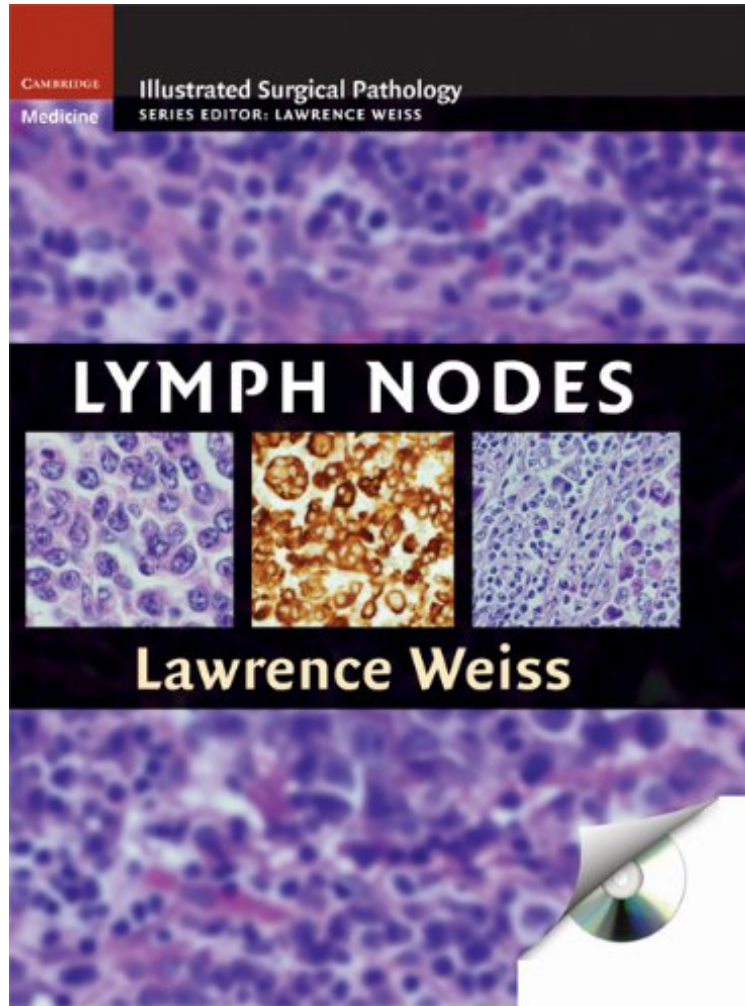

Dr. Weiss goes through the various neoplastic and non-neoplastic lymph node disorders and gives a clear and thorough differential diagnosis, along with very current use of immunohistochemical, cytogenetic, and molecular studies. Additionally there are excellent charts for those of us who are more visually inclined. I would highly recommend this book to any pathologist in training or in practice.
